



Instructions for Presenters

Thank you for presenting at the National Equally Well 2021 Symposium.

Your presentation is scheduled for **20 minutes**. The time and placement of your presentation will be indicated in the program. You can choose to present for the entire 20 minutes or talk for less time to allow for 3 to 5 minutes of questions. Please note the **time limits will be adhered to strictly** out of respect to the other presenters. For first time presenters, our advice is get straight into the main content, as the actual presentation always takes longer than rehearsals! Try to ensure you have time to present your major findings and conclusions, as this is often the most important aspect, but ironically also the part that is missed or glossed over if you run short of time, because you spent too much time on the background and introduction.

Your PowerPoint presentation

Please email or upload your PowerPoint presentation to lcobb@csu.edu.au by **02 August 2021**. If you are unable to upload your presentation before the symposium please contact Lee Cobb, 02 6365 7630. Your file should be named in the following format: Day # (1 or 2) Surname_ Firstname.pptx.

Please bring a backup of your presentation on USB with you to the symposium, and provide it on a USB when you register. All presenters will be asked to check the upload (file) prior to your presentation. Please allow time to do this prior to your session. A student volunteer will be there to help. Even if you do not have a PowerPoint presentation, please visit the room and confirm with the volunteer that you have arrived.

Symposium proceedings – your final paper

A key part of Equally Well is sharing information and facilitating collaboration. Your Powerpoint Presentation will be shared on the Equally Well website along with video recordings (should they be recorded).

In addition all presenters are invited to submit a written paper for inclusion in the symposium proceedings by **19 September 2021**. Please email your written paper to lcobb@csu.edu.au. Equally Well offer the option of three types of written papers, from dot point, summaries through to peer-reviewed papers. The paper can be any length from **500 to 3,000 words**.
